


## Family Fun Night Recap

#### Nurse's Notes

Well, it's that time of the year again, friends. School and extracurricular activities are in full swing. We're creeping up on the holiday season and everyone is busy, busy! You may have noticed in the last few weeks that it is darker in the morning and the sunlight is vanishing more rapidly every evening.

In fact, during October the upper Midwest lost about 1.5 hours of daylight. This is then perpetuated by Daylight Saving Time on November 2nd, when it will be darker even earlier in the evening. With the lack of sunlight you may experience more mood instability. This is commonly known and Seasonal Affective Disorder, or by its accurately descriptive acronym SAD. SAD is a specific type of depression that occurs during certain seasons of the year; typically in late autumn and winter months, but can occur during any season. It is characterized by increased anxiety, depression, changes in appetite and sleep patterns, and increased irritability, inability to concentrate, and lack of motivation. The actual cause of SAD is unknown but is most likely due to lack of exposure to sunlight, which affects hormones, most notably serotonin and melatonin.

SAD is diagnosed with a thorough evaluation by a medical doctor or psychologist and can be affectively treated with medications, cognitive therapy, and phototherapy (light therapy). SAD can also be managed personally by maintaining exercise, healthy diet, increasing vitamin D intake, and getting as much natural light as possible. If you feel your life is being negatively affected by SAD, there are effective treatments that may help. Don't push aside feelings of depression as a normal "winter funk." Take the initiative to keep yourself well during all seasons of life. Blessings to you, and stay well.

## Our Savior's and Augustana Celebrate Bach Together








#### Give the Gift of Goodies
